

**American Bar Association
Section of Public Contract Law
2009 Writing Competition Rules**

- (1) The competition will be conducted in two divisions. Each division will be judged separately, and separate prizes will be awarded to the winners of each division. Division I is open to candidates for a J.D. degree attending law schools within the United States and its possessions. Division II is open to lawyers under the age of 36 years or admitted to practice less than five years as of September 30, 2009, and candidates for an LL.M. degree attending law schools within the United States and its possessions. All authors must be current members of the American Bar Association.
- (2) Papers should address a topical issue of interest to the public contract and grant law community. The *Public Contract Law Journal* maintains a list of suggested note and article topics. Please see http://www.pclj.org/Writing_Competitions/Writing_Competition.html.
- (3) All authors must certify that all work submitted is the author's work product without substantial editing by others. Papers prepared for law school credit are eligible for entry in the competition. Articles prepared for law review, or publication elsewhere, are eligible for the competition provided they are not published prior to October 15, 2009. Joint papers are not acceptable.
- (4) Papers must be 8-1/2" x 11", double-spaced, and typed in 12-point font, including cited material and footnotes.
- (5) Papers shall conform to the Harvard Bluebook citation style and the *Public Contract Law Journal* Style Guide.
- (6) The following information shall be presented on the title page: title; author's name; ABA membership number; law school attending and author's year in school, if applicable; for Division II entries, the author's age or years of practice, if applicable; date submitted for academic credit or law review publication, if applicable; author's permanent and temporary addresses and telephone numbers.
- (7) Copies may be submitted by e-mail or regular U.S. mail (if by mail, please send 3 copies and an electronic copy on a CD), in Word format, to the following address: Karen L. - (8) All entries must be postmarked (or if transmitted by e-mail received) by September 30, 2009.
- (9) Winners will be selected and notified by January 15, 2010. The first place winner in each division will receive a cash award of \$5,000; second place in each division will receive a cash award of \$2,500; and third place in Division I will receive a cash award of \$1,000. Winning entries will be considered for publication in the *Public Contract Law Journal*, and selected competitors may be invited to present their papers during the Annual Federal Procurement Institute in Annapolis, Maryland; however, publication and presentation decisions are made independently of the writing competition and there is no guarantee that a winning entry will be published or selected for presentation.
- (10) An impartial panel will judge the entries. The judges may withhold some or all of the awards if the submissions are not of notable quality. In the event of a tie, the award will be shared.
