

RESOLUTION IN MEMORY OF VICTOR ROSENBLUM

WHEREAS our friend and colleague Victor Rosenblum, Professor of Law Emeritus at Northwestern University School of Law, passed away on March 13, 2006;

WHEREAS, Professor Rosenblum was a nationally recognized scholar in political science, administrative law, and constitutional law at Northwestern University for almost 50 years;

WHEREAS Professor Rosenblum carried a full teaching load during the course of his lengthy final disabling illness and was teaching on the very day before he died, thereby demonstrating his powerful commitment to teaching as his major life work;

WHEREAS Professor Rosenblum, as author, scholar, man of principle and strong beliefs, long-time member of the Administrative Conference of the United States, and leader of this Section, was for decades a leading figure in American administrative law -- a mentor to many other leaders of this Section; one who consistently strove to blend the teachings of political science and administrative law, to make our administrative procedures fairer to the underprivileged, to improve the techniques of legal education, and to make the legal profession a noble and honorable one;

WHEREAS, in his distinguished career, Professor Rosenblum served as a college president, counsel to the U. S. House of Representatives, president of the Association of American Law Schools, and as a visiting professor in Belgium and China and numerous law schools in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Professor Rosenblum served as Chair of this Section in 1977-78, was a long-time leader of our Section, and through his energy, good humor, innate

modesty, wisdom, and persuasive insights contributed so much to this Section and the development of administrative law;

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Section expresses our deep sadness at Victor's passing, our condolences to his wife, Louise, his eight children, and many grandchildren, and honors his memory for his numerous contributions to this Section, the law school world, and the legal profession.
