



**MEMBERSHIP REPORT  
2005 SPRING MEETING  
SAVANNAH, GEORGIA**

**Overall**

Total section membership for the period ending March 31, 2005 stands at 18,676. When we last met at the 2005 Midyear Meeting in February in Salt Lake City, the Section's membership had swelled to over 20,000. However, February 28, 2005 was ABA's designated date to drop any non-paid members from the membership books. Therefore, as we look at our membership for March 2005, we see the impact of the drop.

Our Section dropped a total of 1,102 lawyer members at the end of February 2005. Of that 1,102 people, 964 of them dropped out of the ABA altogether. Only 138 people dropped our Section but chose to continue to be ABA members.
