This Brown Bag will cover advanced issues in the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standards (PCI DSS), which are security standards that apply to any entity that stores, processes or transmits payment card information. Since these standards were issued by the payment card associations 3 years ago, they have amounted to a compliance challenge for virtually all companies that are bound by them. This brown bag will address some of the common hurdles that companies have faced in their compliance endeavors.

Speakers will include Keith Enright of Limited Brands and Michael McNeil of Pitney Bowes, both of whom have been involved with the PCI DSS compliance programs within their companies. They will discuss the challenges their companies have faced with the PCI standards, and how these challenges were overcome. Additionally, Al Hannagan of Trustwave will be speaking from the perspective of an outside PCI compliance auditor. He will discuss how his company, as outside auditors, interpret some of the challenging requirements of the PCI standards.

The program will be moderated by Kristen J. Mathews of Thelen Reid Brown Raysman & Steiner LLP, vice-chair of the Privacy and Information Security Committee.

The speaking portion of the program will last approximately 60 minutes and will be followed by Q&A. PowerPoint presentations will be e-mailed prior the morning of the call so participants can follow along and view the slides that are the subject of the presentation.
