**PART EIGHT: JURY INSTRUCTIONS**

The Civil Practice and Procedure and Trial Practice Committees are pleased to announce Part Eight of their eight-part Brown Bag series on litigating complex civil antitrust class action cases from the initial investigation through trial. Geared toward junior and mid-level attorneys, the panelists will discuss nuts-and-bolts topics along with complex strategic considerations and recent legal developments. This final part, Jury Instructions, will feature insight from seasoned practitioners from the plaintiff's and defense bar, and a prominent federal district court judge who recently presided over a civil antitrust conspiracy jury trial. As with the other programs, this final part works off a common hypothetical fact pattern—an alleged conspiracy to restrain trade in the pet food market—though this will serve only as a launching point for discussion.

The first Brown Bag focused on litigating civil cases emerging out of criminal antitrust investigations and indictments. The second Brown Bag discussed complaints and responses to complaints. The third program discussed working with economics experts. The fourth Brown Bag focused on class certification. The fifth discussed strategies for summary judgment. The sixth focused on how to use jury consultants, and the seventh focused on opening statements. This session, the last Brown Bag in the series, is entitled "Jury Instructions" and will discuss the final stage of our hypothetical litigation. **Even if you did not participate in any of the prior programs, please note that each Brown Bag is a standalone program that does not require participation in any of the others.**
