In 2006, he re-joined the FTC as Commissioner coming from the San Francisco office of Latham & Watkins, where he was the former managing partner and most recently a partner, working in the firm's antitrust and health care and life sciences divisions. Commissioner Rosch served as chair of the American Bar Association's Antitrust Section in 1990, and he has chaired the California Bar Association's Antitrust Section.
