

Biographical sketch: Ian S. Forrester, Q.C.

Ian Forrester practises European law in Brussels with White & Case, specialising in the fields of competition, trade, sport, broadcasting and pharmaceutical regulation. He has appeared before the European Court of Justice, the European Court of First Instance, the EFTA Court, the ECHR, the House of Lords, the Court of Session (Scotland), the High Court (England). Before the European Courts, he has represented the European Commission, NDC and Microsoft in, respectively, the Magill, IMS and Microsoft appeals (compulsory licensing); UEFA in the Bosman case (professional football); GlaxoSmithKline (parallel trade); and Hans-Martin Tillack in Tillack v Belgium (immunity of journalists' sources). Among his pending cases are Sot. Lélos et al v GSK (Article 82 and pharmaceuticals) and Nintendo v Commission (fining policy). He has lectured to academic and private bodies in Europe, North America and Japan, and has published extensively in academic literature. He was appointed Queen's Counsel (1988), and Visiting Professor in European Law at Glasgow University (1991).
