

## Julie Brill

Julie Brill is an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Vermont. She is co-chair of the National Association of Attorneys General Privacy Working Group and Fair Credit Reporting Working Group. Julie has spearheaded Vermont's litigation and legislative efforts in a wide variety of areas affecting consumers, including pharmaceutical issues, privacy, fair credit reporting, tobacco, and antitrust. Julie has been a Vice-Chair of the Consumer Protection Committee of the American Bar Association since 2002. In 2001, Julie received the Brandeis Award from Privacy International for her work in Vermont and nationally promoting consumers' interests in privacy issues. In 1995, Julie received the Marvin Award from the National Association of Attorneys General, for her "outstanding leadership, expertise and achievement in advancing the goals of the association." She graduated magna cum laude from Princeton University, and from New York University School of Law, where she had a Root-Tilden scholarship for her commitment to public service.
