

Damien Geradin is a Professor of Competition Law and Economics at Tilburg University (The Netherlands) and a member of TILEC. His areas of research include general antitrust, network industries, and the interface between antitrust and IP. Damien is the Director of the Global Competition Law Center (GCLC), a think tank devoted to analytical research in the area of competition law, which is based at the College of Europe in Bruges (Belgium). He also held visiting Professorships in a number of leading US Universities including Columbia, Harvard, UCLA and Yale.

Geradin is also a partner in the Brussels office of the international law firm Howrey LLP. Howrey is a firm specialized in antitrust, IP, and litigation. He is the European editor of the Journal of Competition Law and Economics. He has published more than 75 legal and economic papers in a variety of academic journals. Damien Geradin's work has been quoted by the European Court of Justice, the US Court of Appeals (10th Circuit), as well as in numerous regulatory proceedings. Damien Geradin is the co-author of Controlling Market Power in Telecommunications: Antitrust vs. Sector-specific Regulation (Oxford University Press, 2003) with M. Kerf and Global Antitrust Law and Economics (Foundation Press, 2007) with E. Elhauge.
