



Frank Maier-Rigaud is an economist in the Directorate General for Competition of the European Commission. He has worked many years in the Policy Directorate providing case support and working on projects such as Article 82, antitrust remedies and private enforcement. He currently works in the Energy Directorate. Besides his work at the European Commission, he remains affiliated with the University of Bonn and the Max Planck Institute in Bonn, Germany where he applies experimental and game theoretic tools to antitrust issues.

He has represented the Commission in numerous conferences and international seminars and has written and lectured on competition policy, industrial organization, game theory and public economics.

In the past he held academic positions at Indiana University Bloomington and the University of California, Berkeley. Among others he is a member of the American Economic Association and the Verein für Socialpolitik. He has received various research grants and fellowships.
