Alexis L. Barbieri is an Executive Deputy Attorney General with the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, where she is the Director of the Public Protection Division. In this capacity, she directs the Attorney General's law enforcement efforts in areas related to the rights of individual residents of the Commonwealth. The various sections of the Public Protection Division include the Bureau of Consumer Protection, Health Care, Charitable Trusts and Organizations, Antitrust, Civil Rights Enforcement and Tobacco Enforcement. The scope of the division is statewide, and provides guidance and assistance to other law enforcement agencies across the Commonwealth in matters relating to the public.

Ms. Barbieri started her legal career as a law clerk for the Honorable Vincent A. Cirillo, a judge of the Superior Court of Pennsylvania. She has held positions in the Tort Litigation Section of the Office of Attorney General; as Staff Counsel for Continental Insurance Company; and, with the Office of Chief Counsel for the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. In private practice, Ms. Barbieri represented plaintiffs and defendants in personal injury actions in the state and federal courts of Pennsylvania and New Jersey. In addition to practicing in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, she is admitted to the Bars of the states of California and Missouri.

Alexis Barbieri is a member of the Philadelphia Bar Association; Pennsylvania Bar Association; the Justinian Society of Philadelphia; and, is currently President of the Lawyer=s Club of Philadelphia. She is an instructor for the Pennsylvania Bar Institute for various courses, including Trial Techniques and Trial Practice, and Sovereign Immunity. In addition to her professional activities, Ms. Barbieri has been a volunteer attorney for the Philadelphia Volunteers for the Indigent Program (V.I.P.), and has served on the boards of other educational and civic organizations.

Ms. Barbieri received her J.D. from the Widener University School of Law where she was a member of the Moot Court Honor Society and the recipient of the AmJur Award for the highest grade in Torts. She was also a member of the Student Bar Association, Phi Alpha Delta and a contributor to the Law Forum. She received her A.B. in French from the University of Pennsylvania, and was a member of the National French Honor Society.
