

Mr. Botti is the Chief of the Litigation I Section of the U.S. Department of Justice's Antitrust Division. The Section has responsibility for mergers and civil conduct antitrust matters in the healthcare industry and a number of other industrial sectors. Mr. Botti has had substantial involvement in many of the Department's healthcare enforcement efforts since joining the Department in 1994. He was a member of the joint DOJ-FTC drafting team for the 1996 revisions to the healthcare and antitrust policy statements and supervised much of the Division's participation in the recent DOJ-FTC healthcare hearings.

Mr. Botti has been actively involved in the enforcement of antitrust laws in the healthcare sector. He has litigated on behalf of the Department antitrust challenges to the activities of insurers and hospitals. In 1997, he was the lead trial attorney in the United States' challenge to the merger of the North Shore Health System and Long Island Jewish Medical Center on Long Island, New York. He was a member of the Department's litigation team in its 1997 challenge to Delta Dental of Rhode Island's MFN clause. Mr. Botti was also lead or co-lead attorney on the Department's challenges to physician-hospital organizations in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and Danbury, Connecticut.

Mr. Botti received his law degree from Case Western Reserve University in 1985 and undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College in 1982.
