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Before joining AOL, Mr. Bowie served in a number of positions at the Federal Trade Commission, including as legal advisor to Chairman Timothy J. Muris. As Chairman Muris's legal advisor, Mr. Bowie worked on the FTC's major consumer protection initiatives, including the National Do Not Call Registry. Mr. Bowie also served as Assistant Director of the Division of Financial Practices, Assistant Director of the Division of Advertising Practices, and as a trial attorney at the FTC. He also prosecuted criminal telemarketing fraud cases as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Middle District of Pennsylvania. Mr. Bowie is a recipient of the FTC's Louis D. Brandeis Outstanding Litigator Award.

Mr. Bowie graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Law School, where he was an editor of the *Journal of International Business Law*. He graduated with high honors from the College of William and Mary, where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa.
