

Terry Calvani

Terry Calvani practices antitrust law in the Washington, D.C. office of Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer. Previously he served as Commissioner of the US Federal Trade Commission (1983-1990) where he was acting Chairman during 1985 and 1986, and later as a Member of the Irish Competition Authority and Director of the Criminal Cartels Division. During that period he was an active member of Advisory Committees for the EU Competition Directorate.

Following his graduation from the Cornell Law School, where he was Articles Editor of the Law Review, he practiced with the Pillsbury firm. From 1974-1983, Mr. Calvani was Professor of Law at Vanderbilt School of Law teaching courses on antitrust law. More recently he has taught antitrust law at Duke University School of Law (2000), the Harvard Law School (1998-2001), Trinity College, Dublin (2004-2005) and Cornell Law School (2006). Following his term on the F.T.C., he returned to private practice with the Pillsbury firm until his Irish appointment.

He has served as chairman of several ABA Antitrust Section committees and two terms on its governing council. He is a member of the American Law Institute and serves on the Advisory Board of the *Antitrust Bulletin*. Mr. Calvani has written and spoken extensively on antitrust issues.

While in private practice, Mr. Calvani has worked on acquisitions/joint ventures in a very large number of industries and their review by numerous competition agencies. He has participated in civil and criminal investigations in many industries by both federal and state authorities. He has also provided antitrust counselling to a large number of companies and several trade associations.
