### **Continuing Legal Education**

Over 40 CLE events designated as general sessions or committee programs are scheduled for March 31 – April 2, 2004. A general session is an educational presentation, usually in panel format, presented by one or more of the Section's committees. A committee program is an educational presentation by one or more speakers, which is normally presented by a single Section committee and is targeted to individuals with expertise in the substantive area of that committee. Topics for both cover up-to-the-minute issues across the spectrum of antitrust law.



Accreditation has been requested for this meeting for each general session and committee program from each state that has a mandatory continuing legal education requirement for lawyers. While each state granting such credit makes its own determination as to the number of credit hours to be awarded for attendance, you will be eligible for MCLE credits, including ethics credits, for attending the 2004 Spring Meeting.

Certificate of Attendance and detailed instructions regarding obtaining CLE credits will be included in your registration kit. The Antitrust Section has applied for CLE credit in all states where applicable. Attendees must sign-in at each CLE program. Attendees requesting Pennsylvania credits will be required to pay CLE fees directly to the state of Pennsylvania. Attendees requesting New York credits will be required to sign-in and out of each CLE session. You may call the American Bar Association Center for Continuing Legal Education at 312/988-6217, beginning three weeks prior to the start of the meeting, with questions regarding the number of credit hours available at each program.

### Course Materials

Three bound volumes of course materials are included in your registration. Course materials for each CLE program, supplied to the Section Office prior to the meeting, will be compiled into course books for the meeting. One set of the materials will be supplied to each registrant. Additional copies may be purchased at a cost of \$150.00 per set. The Antitrust Fundamentals book must be purchased separately.

The Antitrust Fundamentals session is designed to provide both an introduction to the principles of antitrust law to those new to the field, as well as a refresher course for more experienced practitioners. Antitrust Fundamentals will kick-off the meeting at 8:45 am - 12:15 pm, on Wednesday, March 31, 2004 in Salons I and II.

The Antitrust Fundamentals book is not included in your meeting registration fee; however is available for purchase using the registration form. Vouchers for pre-ordered Antitrust Fundamentals course materials will be included in the registration kit that you pick up upon check-in. Vouchers will not be mailed in advance of the meeting. The voucher must be redeemed in the Antitrust Expo. Those who do not pre-order Fundamentals materials will be charged \$45 on-site. Fundamentals materials will be available after the meeting for non-attendees at a cost of \$75 per copy while supplies last.
