

Sample Bar Association Bylaw Provisions Regarding the Executive Director

Virgin Islands Bar Association-Bylaws

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director shall be appointed by the Board of Governors on terms the Board shall establish and shall serve at its pleasure with such compensation as set from time to time by the Board. The Executive Director shall be in charge of the Association headquarters, shall be responsible for hiring and termination of staff members, and shall perform other duties as the Board may direct.

Pennsylvania Bar Association-Bylaws

Section 516. The Executive Director. -- The Executive Director shall administer the facilities and staff of the Association subject to the direction of the Board of Governors and the President. Any administrative function of an officer of the Association may be delegated to and performed by or under the direction of the Executive Director.

Santa Clara Bar Association-Bylaws

Section 4. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.

The Executive Committee subject to approval by the Board of Trustees shall appoint and/or dismiss the Executive Director of the Association. The Executive Director shall manage the daily administrative and financial operations of the Association and shall have the power to appoint and dismiss other employees. The Executive Director shall upon request of the President or Board of Trustees represent the Association at any function or meeting and shall perform other duties as designated by the President or the Board of Trustees.

Lake County Bar Association-Bylaws

Section 6. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. The Association shall employ an executive director and such other employees as are needed to conduct the operations and affairs of the Association. Such employees shall be hired by the President with the approval of the Executive Committee. Involuntary termination of such employment shall be by the Executive Committee

Minnesota State Bar Association-Bylaws

9.56 Executive Director. The Executive Director shall administer the facilities and staff of the MSBA subject to the direction of the Board of Governors.

Sacramento Bar Association-Bylaws

Section 3.7.E Executive Director

The President, with the advice and consent of the Bar Council, may appoint or remove the Executive Director, who need not be a member of the Association, to serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Association. The Executive Director shall serve under the direction of the President and shall manage, direct and discharge the business of the Association, and shall supervise all employees with the authority to either hire or discharge Association personnel.

Alaska Bar Association-Bylaws

Section 7. Executive Director; Staff.

The Board may employ an Executive Director to serve at its pleasure and assist it in carrying out its functions. The Executive Director is the staff director of the Association.

He or she shall have the qualifications, duties and responsibilities, prescribed by the Board. With the approval of the Board, the Executive Director may employ other staff required for the efficient functioning of the Association.

Columbus Bar Association—Bylaws

2.4 The Board of Governors. The Board of Governors shall appoint the Executive Director; approve and confirm all committee appointments made by the president; counsel and advise the President and other Officers; prepare and adopt the annual budget of the Association; fix the compensation to be paid to the Executive Director; authorize and approve expenditures made by the Officers and direct the activities of the Association in the interim between business meetings of the Association and determine questions of policy except as otherwise herein provided; fill vacancies in office and on the Board of Governors for an unexpired term and determine when a vacancy may exist; provide such office accommodations for the Association as the Board may deem proper; and, with the President, direct and supervise the work of the Executive Director. The Board of Governors shall have all the powers and duties necessary or appropriate for the administration of the affairs of this Association and may do all such acts and things as are not by law or by the Articles of Incorporation or by this Code of Regulations directly to be exercised and done by members including, but not limited to, the power to borrow money; acquire grants or gifts; enter into contracts on behalf of the Association; purchase, sell, mortgage, lease or otherwise acquire or dispose of property, real or personal. The Executive Director shall have such authority and perform such duties as may be assigned to that position from time to time by either the President or the Board of Governors.

Orange County Bar Association-Bylaws (FL)

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director shall be chosen annually by the Executive Council of the Association. He or she shall perform such executive and administrative duties as may be assigned to him or her by these Bylaws and by the Executive Council of the Association. The Executive Director shall maintain the records of the Association and the Executive Council, under the charge of the Secretary and Treasurer. He or she shall maintain and be in charge of the offices and properties of the Association and shall devote his or her full time to the work of the Association. The Executive Director need not be a member of the Association. The Executive Council shall fix his or her salary and other benefits and emoluments of office.
