The Defense Security Cooperation Agency has issued new guidelines and a new Contractor's Certification and Agreement form that significantly changes the requirements for government-financed Direct Commercial Contracts (DCCs) with foreign governments. U.S. funded commercial defense contracts with foreign governments have been the subject of federal prosecutions, qui tam actions, ongoing audit oversight, and DOD/IG investigations.
