

Alexandra E. Teitz - Biography

Alexandra E. Teitz is a counsel on the Democratic staff of the Committee on Government Reform, U.S. House of Representatives (ranking member Rep. Henry A. Waxman). Ms. Teitz focuses on environmental, energy, and regulatory issues. From 1994 to May 2001, she was an attorney in the Office of General Counsel, U.S. EPA, where she handled mainly clean air rulemakings and litigation. Her project areas included: climate change; multi-pollutant legislation; interstate pollutant transport programs; the national low emission vehicle program; motor vehicle fuels; stratospheric ozone; and effluent discharges from coal mining operations. Ms. Teitz received a J.D. from the Boalt Hall School of Law, U.C. Berkeley (Order of the Coif), a Masters in Environmental Studies from the School of Forestry and Environmental Studies, Yale University, and a B.A. in Government and History from Oberlin College.
