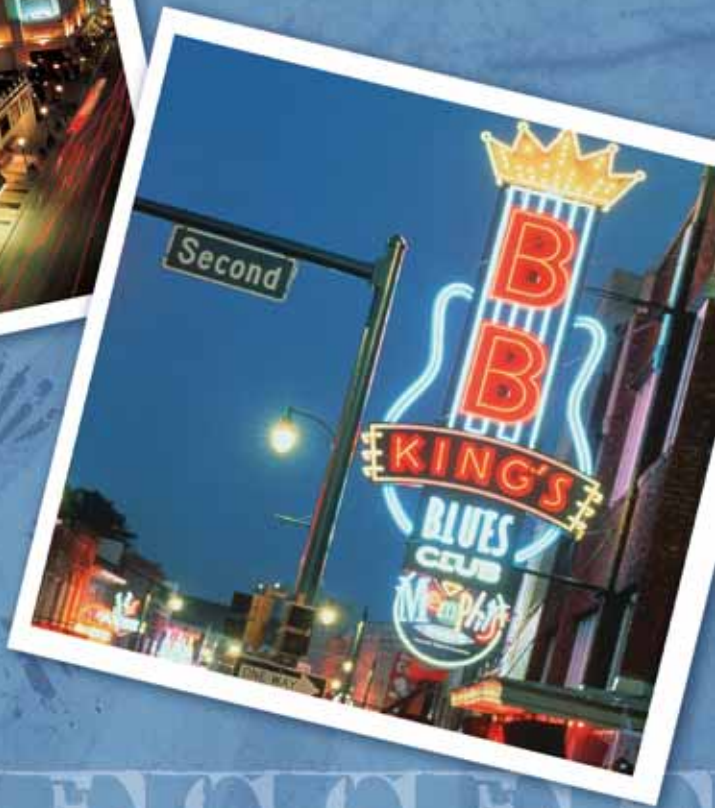

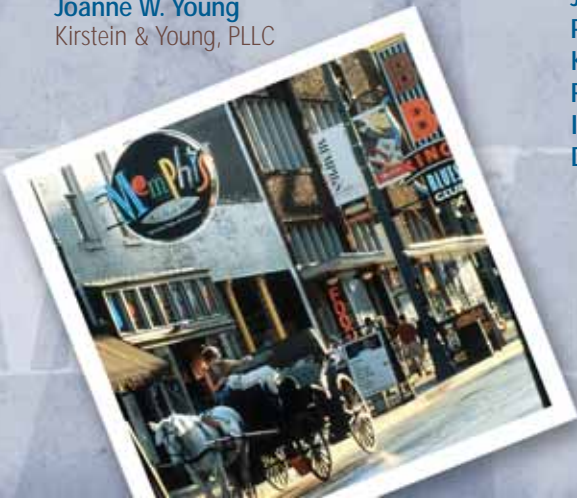

Sheegog from Tennessee when Oxford was a tiny 1840s frontier settlement.
