



The Universal Declaration of Human Rights at 60: Progress on Its Promise?

Heather Grady is the Director of Policy and Partnerships for *Realizing Rights: The Ethical Globalization Initiative*, founded by Mary Robinson in 2002 and headquartered in New York. She is particularly involved in programs on global trade, promoting the right to ‘decent work’ opportunities, and business and human rights. She has spent most of the last two decades working in developing countries managing long-term development and humanitarian programs in East Asia, the Gaza Strip and Sudan. Before joining Realizing Rights she served as the Global Lead on Rights and Institutional Accountability for Oxfam Great Britain, and in that capacity headed Oxfam’s work on a report exploring the ‘poverty impact’ of Unilever in Indonesia. From 2000-2004 she was based in Thailand as Oxfam's Regional Director for East Asia, and before that was Oxfam's Country Representative in Viet Nam, where she resided from 1993 to 2000.

Heather has written extensively on international development and human rights, and co-authored one of the first books on participatory appraisal methodology. She holds degrees from Smith College and the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. She lives in New York.
