**Opportunities for Judicial Clerkships  
at the Highest Levels of the Judiciary**

Do you know a young lawyer whose starting date at his or her law firm has been deferred due to the economy? Are you a judge whose court might need some extra help from a bright young lawyer during this coming year? If so, please read on and check out the PSLawNet website for these opportunities. Also, be sure to tell your colleagues about this program since nearly all of us know of someone who has been deferred and who may be looking to do public service in this interim period.

In an effort to assist new law firm associates who have had their starting dates deferred, the ABA Judicial Division, in collaboration with the National Association for Law Placement (NALP) has instituted an online clearinghouse of opportunities -- on NALP's [PSLawNet website](http://www.pslawnet.org) -- for deferred associates who are interested in applying for an unpaid clerkship with a state or federal court in the United States (or its territories) during the deferral period, commencing as soon as September, 2009. Courts in such locations as Indiana, Wisconsin, Oregon, Kansas, Hawaii and Guam are currently posting available positions and many more are expected to sign onto the website in the near future.
