\*Competition lasts two days. Host schools to determine whether they will host on Friday/Saturday or Saturday/Sunday.

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** In order to more equitably distribute the participating teams among the regional competition locations, participating law schools will be offered the opportunity to rank their regional location preferences. The online ranking is will be included on the entry form, which is expected to be accessible from the ABA Law Student Division's website in May.

The Law Student Division will make every effort to honor each school's first or second choice, with preference given to schools based on geographic proximity. Each school will receive official notification of its regional assignment by October 2, which will also indicate whether the school may send one or two teams to the regional competition. Participants should not make travel plans until they have received their official regional assignment from the ABA Law Student Division.
