The Supreme Court Speaks: 14 Penn Plaza LLC v Pyett and the Duty to Arbitrate Statutory Claims Under a Collective Bargaining Agreement

April 28, 2009 (1:00 p.m. – 2:30 p.m. Eastern Time)

By a 5 to 4 vote, the Supreme Court held on April 1, 2009, that a collective bargaining agreement that clearly and unmistakably requires union members to arbitrate claimed violations of the Age Discrimination in Employment Act is enforceable. However, the decision leaves many questions unanswered, including: what language constitutes a clear waiver; whether an employee has a right to pursue a claim of discrimination before the EEOC and federal court if the union declines to pursue arbitration; and whether the employee's substantive statutory rights can be vindicated in a traditional labor arbitration. Hear an expert panel discuss these issues and many others, as they address the impact of *Pyett* on employees, employers and unions.
