#### **PUBLIC NUISANCE TORT LITIGATION**

### HOT TOPICS IN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW

The scope of environmental law is ever and rapidly expanding. In some jurisdictions environmental regulators are downloading Brownfields site remediation sign-offs to environmental consultants and with much controversy. Governments are legislating green energy – CleanTech – by conservation, new renewable sources and clean distributed energy with streamlined approvals, reduced setbacks and priority rights to connect to the electricity grid. Facilitating new CleanTech is funding from the private sector, venture capitalists and governments. Industry is racing to “green” its products and some face the risk to reputation of “greenwashing” – spinning products as environmentally friendly without substantiated benefits. Governments are requiring in law toxic reduction strategies from industrial and commercial users of toxic substances including materials accounting, toxic reduction plans, reporting and public disclosure. Our speakers will examine each of these emerging hot environmental law issues and then our panel will respond to questions.

### RECENT DEVELOPMENTS & ETHICAL ISSUES IN CLASS ACTIONS

Class action litigation continues to be prolific, and the toxic tort and environmental arenas have provided fertile ground for class action suits. This panel will focus on the issues raised in *In re: Teflon Products Liability Litigation* in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Iowa. In 2005, counsel for plaintiffs filed a \$5 billion class action lawsuit against DuPont de Nemours, alleging, inter alia, that DuPont made false, misleading and deceptive representations about its product, Teflon. Counsel for plaintiffs and defendants vigorously litigated the class certification issues before The Honorable Ronald Longstaff, who ultimately declined to certify the class in a ruling issued in December 2008. Judge Bremer and the attorneys on both sides of this case will join us and will address the issues involved, their respective strategies and thoughts about class actions generally and the ethical issues that are central to these types of suits.
